Remembering Edith

Edith Eleanor Roberts Owen December 15, 1917 - November 27, 2015

How do you sum up a life that was just two weeks shy of 98 years? The truth is,

you can't. But, here are a few things that you may or may not know about this very special woman.

Edith Eleanor Roberts was born in Bethlehem, KY to Garnett and Anna Gertrude Roberts. Edith lost her beloved father when she was just 12 years old. She met a young Bird S. Owen, Jr. in her hometown while he was serving an apprenticeship to become a funeral director. They married and moved to Louisville where they opened their first funeral home on Virginia Avenue on August 27, 1939.





Music was an important part of Edith's life from the very beginning. She had a God-given talent and the ability to hear a song and then play it. Edith was the organist and singer for Owen Funeral Home for more than 75 years.

She was the owner and Chairman Emeritus of the Owen Funeral Home where she was also a funeral director. She was a co-owner of Highlands Family Owned Funeral Home.

Edith not only served the families at the funeral home, she served her community. She was president for several years of the WMU at the former Virginia Avenue Baptist Church and the Audubon Baptist Church. She was past president of the Ladies Auxiliary of Funeral

Directors Association of KY. She was on the boards of the Ladies Auxiliary of Southern Baptist Seminary, the Audubon Park Garden Club and Jubilee Housing (Georgetown Circle). She was a member of Eastern Star, Bright Star Chapter #16, Fall City Funeral Directors Association, Audubon Country Club and Audubon Baptist Church where she was the first woman deacon.

Edith Owen was a pioneer in the funeral industry. She worked alongside her husband, Bird, from the opening day of the first funeral home until his death in 1987. She continued to serve the community working alongside their family, daughter Linda and son David, until health issues in recent years caused her to slow down a bit. Edith recalled that when the first funeral home opened, they waited for two months before serving their first family, but from that point until today, their commitment to "sincere service" built one of the most respected funeral homes in Kentucky.

or too small for the family to tackle. Edith, and her mother Anna Roberts, cleaned the funeral home from top to bottom. She remembered it was 15 years before the family could take a vacation. "Funeral service is a seven days a week/24 hour day business," she often recalled. When she became a funeral director, in the United States less than five percent were women. That didn't deter her. Although historically women have been the nurturing caregivers of the family, becoming licensed and earning their respective titles wasn't an easy task. Years of dedication and education went into the professional women in the industry today.

Edith was at the helm.

Edith Owen was a Mother and Grandmother, dedicated to her family. She and Bird were blessed with two children, Linda and David, who continue the family owned and operated funeral homes today. Her daughter Linda, daughter-in-law Pam and her granddaughter, Rachel are following in her footsteps and are also funeral directors. Edith set an example and lived by the philosophy that the funeral industry might

change, but the way in which you treat the families you serve does not. But aside from the impact her professional life had on her family, they are quick to tell you a story or a memory of how she made them laugh. She was plain spoken. She was always up for a good time and ready to join in the fun. Many of the photos on display at her service were of Edith, head thrown back, mouth wide open in the midst of laughter.



She may have been looking to add another title to her name. The Owen family sponsored race cars and drivers for several years. During that time, they won several championships and received a number of awards.

dirt, loving every minute of it, was a common occurance. Both her personal home and the funeral home have won awards for Beautification of the Community.

Edith Owen was a community leader. She worked side by side with her husband, Bird, building their business while she raised her children, provided music for thousands of funeral services and worked tirelessly for her beloved church.

Her generousity of time and energy was widely known in the community. Again, those who eulogized her also told of her generosity of spirit. Edith had a way of leveling the situation and making everyone involved feel her compassion and willingness to help. Everyone who came into her life was likely to be taken under her wing and made an honorary member of the family.
