Steven Wayne Maynard grew up in his childhood home as the oldest of four brothers. There his cherished parents began to shape his famous character of being a reserved, strong, protector and peacemaker. His mother Brenda instilled in him his need to live with a warm, loving, homemaker and his father Wayne trained him in craftsmanship, creativity, and doing good, hard work for others. He was a part of the first classes of Landmark Christian Academy where he would attend all the way through high school, and eventually turn around to support and send his own children through. He moved away for college in Florida for only a short while until he later returned to get a job at Norton Healthcare where he would have the most wonderful coincidence of his life, meeting his precious future bride, Deborah. He made a habit of hand delivering documents to her area instead of having them sent and from there grew the bud which blossomed into the beautiful life they made together. He would go on to begin a career in managing delivery trucks for UPS, and grow his family by having their firstborn, a son named Jordan. A few years, homes, and events later he would go on to switch careers to be a partner in running Fireplace Solutions, and later added on Home Solutions, which was involved in all things fireplaces and generally extravagant carpentry work. He would also grow his family by one more precious member. His daughter Emily Grace was born into their newly refreshed home. He then juggled moving again, and maintained an endless habit of remodeling almost everything he owned to be consistently exercising that engrained trait of blessing his wife with the works of his hands, while raising a teenage son and little daughter. Eventually by the Providence of God he switched over his career once more to become the Vice President of Facility Procurement and Material's Management at Prestige Healthcare, or as he liked to call it, Bob's driver. He was a devoted churchman and big brother in Christ to many in his community, Landmark Baptist Church. Over the years he served as a Sunday school teacher, deacon, and dearest brother. He was known for wearing his faith on his sleeve and making sure everyone knew that the waves of this life and the wind in his sails came directly from the good, sovereign, will of God. He was an ardent studier of John Calvin's Institutes of the Christian Religion in his last years, and yet shared a faith pivoting moment with his son on a missions trip in Japan while reading The Holiness of God, by the much more modern theologian, R.C. Sproul. His favorite collection of books

was his Bible, and he relentlessly encouraged, provoked, and admonished person after person with a truth, challenge, or story from one of these three sources. He is a man of holy grit, who set his face on the prize of knowing and living in step with the God of the Scriptures and resolutely stayed on course through his last breaths of this temporary life. He was made this because of the saving grace of Christ, which by faith he clung to as his only hope of being redeemed to God. He will be remembered and often considered as a holy husband, father, grandfather, son, brother, nephew, uncle, and friend. His faith shined through some of his last words he shared with his wife in the hospital. He said he was not afraid to leave his family and friends here for the rest of this life, because he trusted God with his soul, and since he trusted God with the care of his soul in this life and the next, he certainly would trust him with the care for his loved ones. And so his legacy shall be that he was a good man of resolute, grace-driven, hopeful, and happy faith in God.
