“ Betty Jane was one of a kind . When we would go and all of us stayed all night , Aunt Cora and Uncle Stanley slept on their bed . Welton and Mom (Zora) would sleep on the other bed in that same room. The house had 4 rooms . Us girls would sleep together in the one bed in the other room . Betty Jane , Barbara and Elaine at the top , Judy and myself at the bottom . That was 6 feet we had to smell all night lol , but we always had a lot of fun . Aunt Mary (Uncle Stanley’s mother) still was alive . This was the house that Uncle Stanley’s Dad built . No water(well water) no electricity (cold oil lamps) a free standing stove in the main room and an outhouse ,and a wood burning stove in the kitchen, but they had a radio . Obviously it was a hard life but you would never know it . I spent many summers at their house. One day we were all out on the porch just watching the cars go by and talking. Betty Jane was sitting on the stoop and had on a dress and Aunt Mary scolded her for sitting with her legs spread apart . She told Betty Jane to put her legs together so she “wouldn’t show everything” Betty Jane responded by saying “well then don’t look”! We all died laughing , I don’t think Aunt Mary appreciated that . When Betty Jane came to spend a week at a time with us Barbara and I would fight over who she would sleep with , so we shared her “every other night “ . Her and Bernard would sit in the car out front when they came home which also upset Aunt Mary , but Betty Jane never cared who got upset about it , lol. She had a talent for sewing , just like her Mother . When we first moved to Louisville , they were already here and Betty Jane would make Barbie Doll clothes for me to give as Christmas presents . So Sorry, Beverly and David , on hearing of your Mom’s passing , but like you , I know she is happier to be with Bernard again . Anna Marie
