Reverend Billy Duke Campbell, 89, of Louisville passed away Thursday, September 1, 2022.

Billy was born November 3, 1932 in Brownsville, KY. to his late parents Robert and Marie (Lindsey) Campbell. He is also preceded in death by his four sisters, Ruth, Leona, Eva and Georgia; three brothers, Ray, Ben and Howell. He served his country in the U. S. Air Force during Korea and retired from the Enro Shirt Company. He was a member of Campbells United Baptist Church.
