Byron Ancel Fenoglio, August 27, 1971- July 17, 2019, died after several years of battling heart disease and illnesses. He is preceded in death by his parents, Richard and Dorothy Fenoglio and his beloved brother Richard (Ricky) Fenoglio. He is survived by sister Nancy Pace, brother James (Janice) Fenoglio, and brother Stanley (Gale) Pace, Sister-In-law Anissa Fenoglio, several nieces and nephews.

His Memorial Service will be Friday, July 26. Visitation at 5pm – 6pm and the Memorial Service beginning at 6pm at Owen Funeral Home at 5317 Dixie Highway, Louisville, KY. Owen Funeral Home is graciously providing the cremation and the memorial service, free of charge as a final testimony to the amazing service that Byron Fenoglio shared with the community.

While here on Earth, Byron never had many material possessions, but as he said in a TV interview one time when he was honored for his rescuing/service work during a snowstorm by Louisville Mayor Greg Fischer, "I know what it's like to not have anything. I don't have much now, but I have what I need."

He is best known in the Louisville Random Acts of Kindness Movement for beginning a \$2 Bill campaign in the area. He would hand out \$2 to people he would meet with instructions 'It's yours to use if you need it, if not, pass it on to someone in need!' He gave away hundreds of dollars, one \$2 bill at a time.

While his health was still good, he would often attend, and encourage others to attend, funeral services for the poor and indigent at Meadowview Cemetery, for those people who didn't have anyone to come to their funerals.

Byron's legacy is one of servitude... what can you do today in this world to make someone else's day better? Learn to Throw a Starfish every opportunity you have!

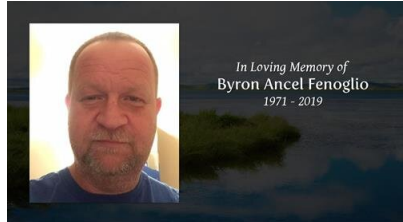
