Carole Marie Pousardien left this world on January 5, 2021 to be with her Lord and Savior following a lengthy struggle with multiple myeloma. She died at her home with her daughter in Rockton, IL. She graduated from Valley High School in 1958 and earned an Associate Degree in Secretarial Sciences from the University of Louisville. Carole married Stephen F. Survivors include her husband of 57 years and their children Stephen Jr. of Hedgesville, WV; Timothy (Jessica) of English, IN; and Ann Marie McLevige (Leonard) of Rockton, IL.
