



Dahl Logan Atterbury

August 31, 1938 - December 20, 2020

The Dahl Logan Atterbury died on December 20, 2020, at Norton Women's and Children's Hospital in Louisville, Kentucky, as a consequence of complications from the coronavirus. Dahl's sister, Teresa Leslie (Atterbury) Munson was with him at his death. Dahl was 82 years old.

Dahl's parents precede him in death: father, Leslie Henry Atterbury; and, mother, Elizabeth Marie (Lynch) Atterbury. Dahl is survived by his brother, Leslie Henry Atterbury, Jr., and Leslie Henry Atterbury, Jr.'s children: Kathleen Marie (Atterbury) Dawson; Teresa June (Atterbury) Kinchen; Elizabeth Lynn (Atterbury) Sharpe; and, Leslie Henry Atterbury, III. Dahl's surviving family members also include: sister, Peggy Marie Shackelford as well as Peggy's daughter, Angela Boyer and Angela's husband Jason Boyer; sister, Teresa Leslie (Atterbury) Munson and Teresa's children Jerry Munson, Jr., Jennifer Munson, and Lesley Munson; brother, Paul H. Atterbury and his wife Leslie M. Randall and their children, Jeffrey Atterbury, Estella Atterbury, and Jackson Atterbury; nephew, Joseph Atterbury, son of Dahl's deceased sister Jennifer Irene Atterbury; and, many great nephews and great nieces.

Born in Louisville, Kentucky, Dahl graduated from Valley High School and spent his life in the Louisville area. During the latter part of Dahl's life, the Colonial House of Shepherdsville was his home. Dahl was very grateful for the staff at the Colonial House who contributed greatly to his quality of life. A

longtime staff leader at the Colonial House described Dahl as the nicest, sweetest resident and that he was a true blessing. Dahl's final resting place is at Cave Hill Cemetery in Louisville, Kentucky, alongside his: father; stepmother, Ruth (Shackelford) Atterbury; and sister, Jennifer Irene Atterbury.

Dahl's family extends heartfelt thanks to the personnel at Norton Women's and Children's Hospital who provided medical care for Dahl and enabled him to communicate with family members via video teleconferencing from his hospital room. The Atterbury family is also thankful for the care and friendships provided Dahl by the staff members and residents at the Colonial House of Shepherdsville.

Uncle Dahl was so kind and pleasant. He will be truly be missed.

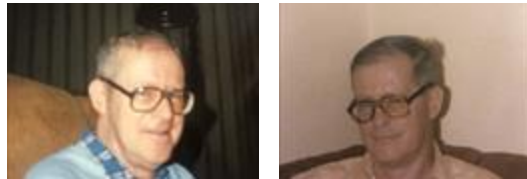
