“ David was my Irish twin, as we were born less than 14 months apart. Throughout our childhood we were inseparable. He, me, and our older brother Dale were the three amigos, doing everything together.

We loved baseball and would play it from sunup to sundown in our backyard. Man, we broke so many windows and had so many bruises, I'm not sure how our mother could stand it. David and I went on to play baseball together every year until he entered high school. He was a flame throwing right hander and I was his catcher: good field, no hit. Our favorite coach was Joe Warren, one of the greatest man either of us ever knew. We were speaking of him just a few weeks ago, and Joe was our coach when we were 9-10.

There are two many stories to tell, but I will share one. Shortly after David and Karen were married, David was sent to Ft. Leonard Woods, in Missouri. They were living in an off base trailer, and I went to visit them over Christmas. They had just been assigned on base housing, so David and I went over to the house--with the approval of the base housing coordinator--to light the furnace and hot water heater in preparation for their move the next day. After lighting the appliances, David and I were standing around the apartment talking about where the furniture would go when, all of a sudden a trail of flame flashed across the floor from the furnace and the damn house blew up! Windows were knocked out and we were on our butts, but otherwise unhurt. We quickly discovered that the previous tenant had disconnected the stove from the gas supply without turning off the supply line. We were so darn lucky to have survived. We were laughing about that adventure recently as well.
