I am sorry that we are unable to attend the calling hours and memorial service in her honor, our ministry requires us to be elsewhere at those times, but I just wanted to let you know how blessed and enriched our lives were because we walked the road of life with Christine for awhile! This past Monday morning, as we prayed around the breakfast table, our 9 year old son specifically prayed for Christine by name and asked God to heal and help her. God certainly has healed her eternally and I can only imagine the joy and delight that she is experiencing in the presence of her Lord and Savior that she served for so long. Thank you for sharing her with our church (Wellman Wesleyan) for so many years - she was such a great lady and will be missed. I pray God comforts you in your time of loss.
