A private service will be held at Highland Cemetery, 2167 Dixie Hwy, Fort Mitchell, KY, 41017.

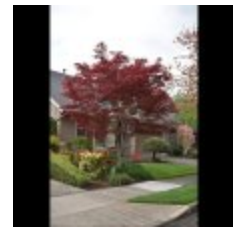
