“ My Aunt Margie was a wonderful woman. I still have a letter she wrote to me in 2000 transferring some AT&T shares to my newborn son Robert "Austin" Bond which were held in custodianship by my father for Austin, until my dad passed last week. No one had ever been thoughtful enough nor generous enough to do something like this before in my life. I have used the letter to motivate my son to think about investing at an early age. A wonderful lesson Aunt Margie & Uncle Tony taught me. I think I was in 5th grade when they first started bringing such matters up for me to think about. Today I am a full time trader combining my meteorology and MBA degrees. But..the small nuggets initially imparted by Aunt Margie and Uncle Tony largely created the interest that formed who I am today. Not to mention hard work and perseverance. Lessons my disabled father on heavy pain meds couldn't articulate by example. Three strong memories....vacation with her and Tony in Nashville and painting their new house in Valley Station...But as well those two carrying up the offerings for my wedding at the Cathedral of Assumption...With my wife's Aunt Betty & Uncle Joe Schutte who we oddly found out later via a family reunion at Sawyer Park...my wife is related to Betty (now passed) and thus Margie's family. In KY it is REALLY a small world.

Aunt Margie was a fun whirlwind to chat with and we could solve the world problems and laugh endlessly doing do. I fondly remember meeting her and Uncle Tony at a restaurant in Bowling Green, KY when they were on a Corvette Club Meet and I attended Broadcasting School at WKU to supplement my Meteorology. She was a MAJOR support for me with often daily discussions during the trying time of being my mother's (Jeanne) Guardian as my mother approached passing away. I also VERY fondly love her talks with me over the last couple years as the last remaining adult who was aware of all the family history as I struggled with a near decade long very unusual deep personal challenge. Aunt Margie was just my anchor amongst the churning sea over the last few years like no one before. I will be eternally grateful for her love, support, insight, and caring conversations during this time. My last talk with her was

to help her with doctor meds that seemed inappropriate for which she was concerned. I had my PharmD wife Victoria further explore the issue, research some attributes of such, and offer alternatives with a follow-up return call. She was keenly aware of her need to take care of herself in the age of Covid and I really enjoyed her enthusiasm and views on the related topics.

To the Breen family....Aunt Margie will be very sorely missed by me. I have no one else who can be her....do what she did, And let's face it...there was & will always be only one Margie Breen Bond.
