Mike graduated from Central High School in Philadelphia in 1965 and from Penn State in 1970 with Bachelor of Science degree in Architectural Engineering and went on to receive a Master of Science degree in Civil Engineering from Purdue University in 1978. Mike served his country with pride as a retired Lt. Commander and a Vietnam Veteran.

Yet, his first love was to serve Jesus along his wife by following the Great

Commission and to share the Good News that Jesus died and gave His life to all that would receive Him. He used his spiritual gifts of administration and teaching the Word to encourage the body of Christ around the world. Mike and Deborah got to enjoy 36 countries together, but Mike beat her by two, 38! His favorite Bible promises were a testimony of his love for Jesus, Psalms 118:24 "This is the day the Lord hath made, rejoice and be glad in it" He lived a life enjoying every day Jesus gave him. 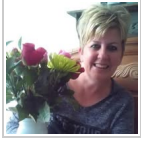
