Later, Olga went on to be the General Manager of Jim Booher Chevrolet. She was also on the Board of Directors for the University of Louisville, as well as many other charities.

“ I'm not sure anyone could capture the life force, energy and ability Olga had in every endeavor. My former husband, Carlos R. Montemayor, deceased, was an advertising executive for Chevrolet's advertising agency, Campbell Ewald in Detroit. Carlos was responsible for 8 or 9 states in aiding dealers to get the most out of their dealership advertising and it was in that capacity that I met Olga and Jim Booher. We were guests in their "farm" home for Kentucky Derby events, and ended up getting a box and regularly making treks to Louisville for the annual event. From day one Olga took us under her wing, so to speak, including us on bus party treks to homes of their friends open for pre-Derby celebrations. When I knew her, the two had taken on the Framehouse Art Gallery, introducing us to the artists whose work they exhibited and in redesigning their dealership, a monumentally challenging and beautiful process. Olga was into every design phase of what she knew would work for everyone invested in working in the facility. I admired her confidence and knowledge of the business, which she and Jim shared. I learned from Olga to pack a suitcase ready for taking on any quick, unexpected trips; how to make a bed comfortable and aesthetically attractive for oneself and guests. I am forever grateful to the two for clearing country club after-meals, food remnants collected for their two St. Bernards and a spaniel, who ate like a stable of horses. My husband at the time couldn't believe I took home restaurant incomplete meals and this rectified his resistance! I remember going to the farm and hearing the positive ending of the recent tale of Jim's hearing loud sounds in the middle of the night, going to the staircase from their bedroom where Olga followed, when they turned to see their bedroom crash downward from the 2nd floor onto the living room below. I remember Olga telling me of her extended family needs in eastern Europe and how she and her family worked hard to send financial support to them. To her surprise when some of that family came to visit in Canada, they were surprised to see that Olga's family did not live as well as they. Life lessons in charity outreach. Olga was open, engaging and tireless. I admired so much about her that has stayed embedded in memory for all time. Thinking of her today, I did a cyber search and
