He worked on the barrel line at the Cooperage for many years while Mrs. Singer (as he always called her) worked in the office. Roy and Harry were like brothers. Both shared a love for Celina, Tennessee, since Roy came from there and Harry had a fishing camp there. Roy and Lovey would always come to Harry's farm and help harvesting and canning vegetables and Roy would also help planting or digging evergreen trees. Roy had a tractor and he would drive it over to Harry's to help with grading and plowing. When Harry did buy a tractor, it was a red Massey-Ferguson just like Roy's. I grew closer to Roy when my mom was recuperating from open-heart surgery and was staying at Frances's house. Both Harry and Lovey had passed at this time, but Roy always checked to make sure they were alright. We would shoot the breeze. I continued contact with Roy after Frances sold the Farm and moved to Hardin County. He always wanted to know if she was OK. In these conversations, Roy was never happier than when he got the box set of "Hee-Haw" and a banjo for Christmas. I don't think he ever got the time to learn how to play that new banjo. Roy was always friendly, as I was leaving my doctor's office and not paying much attention, Roy had come out of another office, and I heard his booming voice say "Hey, Rick!". He will be missed. I will remember Roy and all of the family in my prayers.
