



## Sandra "Sandy" Lynn Wolfe

February 17, 1952 - May 11, 2020

Sandra "Sandy" Lynn Wolfe, 68, of Louisville, passed away Monday, May 11, 2020. She died at home, after an extended journey with Lewy Body Dementia. Sandy was a graduate of UofL with a degree in Art and later became the graphic designer for National Horseman magazine. She retired from Humana as a business consultant and attended Middletown United Methodist Church with her husband, Marshall, whom she also shared a love of art with.

Their first date was at the Speed Art Museum. She was an accomplished Artist, Sandy enjoyed drawing, sculpture, and fabric art.

Sandy was a great partner. She used her artistic eye to help transform homes from fixer-uppers, to finished products. Speed was not a strong point in those projects. Sandy would say, "We are Wolfe construction, we can make any small job big." She also had the warmth to turn a house into a home for herself and her husband.

As a U of L alumni and season ticket holder, she enjoyed attending Cardinal Volleyball games with her husband. They were fortunate to be able to watch coworkers' children play for the Cards through the years, which had an added bonus of getting inside information about the teams.

She was preceded in death by her parents, William T. and Mary Underwood and a brother, Jim Underwood.

She is survived by her husband, Marshall Wolfe; brothers, Bill Underwood (Dee), John Underwood (Amy) and Bob Underwood (Julie); sister-in-law,

Linda Coffey; dear friends, Bonny and Debbye Holmes; 6 nieces/nephews and 8 great nieces/nephews.

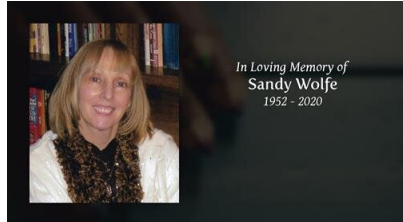
