



## Thomas Ingram Fryer

February 14, 1948 - July 24, 2025

Thomas Ingram Fryer, 77, passed away on July 24, 2025, after a 10 year battle with Parkinson's disease.

Born Feb 14, 1948, in West Chester, PA, he was the son of the late Charles Evans Fryer and Doris Thomson Fryer.

Tom was employed by the US Postal Service in Exton, PA for nearly 30 years. His friendly personality made him a favorite with his customers and he met his wife Kelly while working there.

Tom's favorite hobby was playing pool, and he became a nationally ranked player. He was so proficient that he ran 188 balls which proudly displayed as his license plate. Kelly and Tom married when he was 45 and she was 25. They were delighted to welcome their

daughter Darcy into the world several years later. When illness struck, Tom cared faithfully and attended to Kelly with loving devotion for years while she was on kidney dialysis. After she passed away, he poured himself into their daughter Darcy's life and particularly enjoyed attending her volleyball games.

Tom had a wonderful sense of humor, sweet disposition, and was willing to help when needed.

He will be deeply missed by his family and friends.

He was preceded in death by his loving parents, Doris and Charlie Fryer; his older brother, Teddy Barili, his beloved wife, Kelly Fryer, and his father-in-law, David Blair.
